In the First Reading (Isaiah), the prophet assures the exiles in Babylon that God is coming to save them. The prophecy was fulfilled in the return from exile, but more especially in the coming of Jesus.

John the Baptist was clearly a prophet. Since the spirit of prophecy had long been absent from Israel, John's appearance raised expectations. The question arose: Could he be the Messiah? John denied that he was the Messiah, but declared that the Messiah was at hand. Thus he prepared the way for Jesus.

Baptism was a defining moment in the life of Jesus - it marked the beginning of his public mission. Luke always presents Jesus as praying before making major decisions. It's no surprise then that we find him praying during his baptism. In response to his prayer, the Holy Spirit descends on him in bodily form at the beginning of his mission, just as it will come in visible form on the apostles at Pentecost at the beginning of their mission. The Father puts his seal of approval on Jesus and on the mission he is about to begin.

Commentary on the Doctrine Of the Most Holy Eucharist

(Articles taken from the Compendium of the Catechism of the Catholic Church)

1. The Sacrificial Meaning of Christ's Words

Do this in memory of me - These words of Jesus Christ are inserted into the tradition of the memorial by which through a sacred rite is recalled the liberation accomplished by God when He led His People out of Egypt, with which the book of Exodus deals extensively. By the Rite of Passover, on the fourteenth day of the month of Abib (Nissan), the annual banquet was prepared in which the Jewish People by the command of the Lord commemorated their liberation from Egypt (Ex 12:1-14). The very name of Passover (pesah) signifies the passing over of the Lord who freed the Israelites while He punished the Egyptians; thus begins the Exodus. During the Passover, the Israelites are commanded to eat unleavened bread (because they were leaving in haste from the land of Egypt), bitter lettuce also (lest they completely forget the bitterness of their slavery), and the lamb whose blood they smeared on the doorposts and thresholds, so that by this sign God would spare the firstborn sons of the children of Israel. "Therefore you will have this day as a memorial day." From this verse is applied the Hebrew word zikkaron (memorial). It does not mean a mere remembrance, because the Israelites when celebrating the Passover were bringing to mind the wonders God had done among them as if reminding God of His own deeds, so that God being faithful to Himself and His counsels might repeat such things among the people. For the Passover was a most powerful memorial (Ex 13:3-10) by which, when recalled before God, God by His own word obliged Himself once again to bring about salvation for the People of Israel.

Lord Jesus, touch our eyes so that we may see the signs of your presence in our lives and in the world. Touch our ears so that we may hear your word. Touch our tongues so that we may profess our faith. Touch our hands so that we may give and receive. Touch our feet so that we may walk in your paths. Touch our minds so that we may understand your ways. Touch our wills so that they may be in tune with your will. Touch our hearts so that we may bring your love to our brothers and sisters, to the praise and glory of God. Amen.
