For this and the following two Sundays we will be reading from Luke's 'Sermon on the Plain' which parallels Matthew's 'Sermon on the Mount'.

The First Reading is a little bit of wisdom poetry. It contrasts the wicked who trust in human beings and the righteous who trust in God. The former are compared to a barren desert shrub; the latter to a fruitful tree planted beside a flowing river. This prepares us for the Gospel, where Jesus declares the poor blessed. The poor are the 'little ones' who have no one to trust in but God.

The beatitudes echo the program Jesus announced in the synagogue at Nazareth. Whereas Matthew has nine Beatitudes, Luke has only four, with, however, four corresponding 'woes'.

Commentary on the Doctrine Of the Most Holy Eucharist

(Articles taken from the Compendium of the Catechism of the Catholic Church)

3. Believe that you may understand

We profess one and the same sacrifice because what is celebrated in the Mass is what was offered on the Cross. The Epistle to the Hebrews teaches that the oblation of Christ on the Cross is the sole perfect and absolute expiation of sins. When, however, the sacrifice of expiation is offered in the Mass, it is one and the same sacrifice; otherwise, that which would be done in the Mass would be something other than that which was offered on the Cross and would not be called the self-same perfect oblation.

How the same sacrifice offered two thousand years ago could be represented in the celebration of the Mass creates a great difficulty which, however, can be well explained according to the doctrine handed on in the Epistle to the Hebrews. Christ immolating Himself on the altar of the Cross expiated the sins of all by that one perfect and complete sacrifice. But His oblation was also accepted by the Father, who raised His Son from the dead, so that His own oblation would remain glorious forever in the heavens. The priest of the old law likewise once a year used to enter into the Holy of Holies to offer another's blood. Taking up this matter, the Epistle to the Hebrews teaches that Christ entered into the heavenly tabernacle (Heb 9:22) where the single oblation of His Body remains by which we are all saved (Heb 7:23-25).
