The First Reading contains a message of hope addressed to the Jewish exiles in Babylon. There will be a new exodus, so glorious that it will put the great events of the first exodus in the shade. And all of this will happen because God is faithful to his people.

This prepares us for the Gospel. Christians see the radically new thing that God has done for us in and through Jesus. Specifically we see God's love and compassion in Jesus' treatment of a sinful woman. The story is taken from John, but it resembles the style of Luke. It's an 'entrapment' story which sought to show Jesus' wisdom in besting his adversaries.

The aim of the Scribes and Pharisees was to set a snare for Jesus. If he pardoned the woman, he could be accused of encouraging people to break the law of Moses. If he agreed that she should be stoned, he would lose his name for mercy. But Jesus turned the tables on her accusers by suggesting that they look at their own sins.

Paul has willingly sacrificed everything for the justification that comes from faith in Christ, and for the hope of resurrection (Second Reading). Like a runner at the final stage of a race, he doesn't look back but keeps his eye on the winning tape.

Commentary on the Doctrine Of the Most Holy Eucharist

(Articles taken from the Compendium of the Catechism of the *Catholic Church*)

II. The Real Presence of Christ in the Eucharist

1. Real Presence

The New Testament clearly expresses how one must understand the presence of Christ in the Eucharist. In 1 Corinthians 10:14ff., St. Paul affirms that Christ is truly present under the signs of bread and wine in the Eucharist. After the narration of the Institution of the Eucharist. St. Paul adds: "A person should examine himself, and so eat the bread and drink the cup. For anyone who eats and drinks without discerning the body, eats and drinks judgment on himself" (1 Cor 11:28-29). "Therefore, whoever eats the bread or drinks the cup of the Lord unworthily will have to answer for the body and blood of the Lord" (1 Cor 11:27).

Although St. John omits the institution narrative (differing from the other Evangelists in this regard), he showed that the mystery of the Incarnation was to be perpetuated by the Eucharist. With the sermon on the bread of life in the Synagogue of Capernaum (Jn 6:22), Christ spoke of the bread which came down from heaven through the Incarnation. Thus he asserted: "I am the bread that came down from heaven" (Jn 6:41), and continuing he added, "I am the living bread that came down from heaven; whoever eats this bread will live forever" (Jn 6:51). To stupefied listeners he continued: "Amen, amen, I say to you, unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink his blood, you do not have life within you. Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood has eternal life, and I will raise him on the last day" (Jn 6:53-54). Continued next week.
