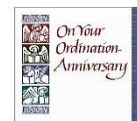


Many Gentiles had accepted Christianity as a result of the preaching of Paul and Barnabas. But then a question arose: how much of the Law and traditions of Moses should be required of these Gentile converts? The answer was: the bare minimum. They must abstain from meat sacrificed to idols, from blood (symbol of life and which belonged to God), from the meat of strangled animals (which still had blood in them), and from marriage within degrees of kindred forbidden to Jews though allowed in other traditions. And so, instead of becoming a Jewish sect, Christianity became a universal religion.

The Gospel reading is taken from Jesus' discourse at the Last Supper, and is dominated by his imminent departure. He is concerned to assure his disciples that he will not leave them orphans. Despite his leaving, he and they will not be apart. If they keep his word they will be drawn into the love of the Father and the Son. The Holy Spirit will remind them of his words. Peace is his final gift to them, a peace the world cannot give.

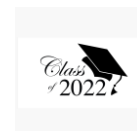

### Registration for the 2022/2023 School Year Going on Now

St. Alphonsus Finance Committee, in conjunction with the Parish Staff, wishes to reiterate the established policy concerning subsidy of our young people at St. Alphonsus Elementary School or St. Patrick High School.

In order for students to receive subsidized tuition at St. Alphonsus Elementary School or St. Patrick High School, the following must be followed:

1. The Family must be registered in St. Alphonsus Parish
2. Contribute to the support of the parish through the regular use of the envelope system or some other agreed upon service.

### Commentary on the Doctrine Of the Most Holy Eucharist

(Articles taken from the *Compendium of the Catechism of the Catholic Church*)

#### II. The Real Presence of Christ in the Eucharist

##### 4. Consequences for the Christian Life

Since Christ is truly present in the Eucharist, in the first place it follows necessarily that the mystery of the Incarnation is perpetuated by it. St. John, speaking of the Incarnation, asserts that the word became flesh (Jn 1:14), but he adds that it dwelt among us. In the Greek text, the verb *skenovin* is used, which means to pitch one's tabernacle or dwelling tent and undoubtedly denotes the original sanctuary of God in the Old Testament, which was positioned outside the camp (Ex 25:8). John himself hands on the words of Christ: "Destroy this temple and in three days I will raise it up" (Jn 2:19); and he explains the meaning: "But he was speaking about the temple of his body" (Jn 2:21), which subsists in the Eucharist.

The Incarnation of the Word occurred at a single moment in time. However, He who became incarnate remains with us as the Temple of God (*shekinah Yahve*); it is no longer in Jerusalem, but everywhere that the Eucharist is reserved, since it is certain that the Risen Christ is present there.

According to the Gospel of John, during Christ's life, the Spirit had not yet been given since Jesus "had not yet been glorified" (cf. Jn 7:39). To be sure, Christ, as a man, was the Son of God from the moment of the Incarnation; nevertheless He did not give the Holy Spirit, because the Spirit is sent into the Church as the fruit of the sacrifice of Christ: Christ offered Himself to the Father on the Cross, which oblation the Father accepted and therefore raised His Son: for the Spirit was embraced by both the Father and the Son when, on the day of Pentecost, He descended upon the Church.
