

**In biblical times it was common for wisdom to be personified.** The reading from Proverbs looks to the role of Lady Wisdom in creation. This speculation about wisdom can be seen as a groping towards the revelation of the mystery of the Trinity. The Second Reading and the Gospel are chosen because they specifically mention the three Persons of the Blessed Trinity, and the role of each Person in our salvation. Paul stresses the role of Christ in our salvation. Through him hostility and alienation are overcome, and we are able to enter into a relationship with the Father. Therefore, we can hope to share God's glory. This sure hope will enable us to persevere in spite of suffering. Through the Holy Spirit God's love is poured into our hearts. The Gospel stresses the role of the Spirit – carrying on in the Church the work of Jesus after Jesus has departed to the Father. There will be no new revelation. There can't be, because Jesus is *the* revelation of the Father. The role of the Spirit will be to spell out to successive generations the contemporary significance of what Jesus said and did.

**Father's Day Collection:** As over the past few years, a special second collection has been scheduled on the weekend of Father's Day to supplement the pension given to diocesan Priests of retirement age. This collection is important to our retired Priests. Priests of the Diocese of Biloxi who do not belong to religious orders are provided with a modest pension in their golden years by an endowment to which parishes pay a yearly assessment. In addition, Priests who are seniors receive a small pension supplement from the Catholic Sharing Appeal. The Diocese has opted to have a special collection for our retired Priests on Father's Day. The proceeds of this Father's Day collection will be used to increase the Diocese's pension supplement.

*Isn't there already a collection for retired Priests?* There are two annual special collections that are sometimes confused with one another, and neither one meets the specific need of providing diocesan Priests with an adequate pension/retirement. The first is the collection to support retired religious. "Religious" refers to women (sisters, nuns) and men (brothers and some Priests) who belong to religious communities such as Dominicans, Benedictines, Franciscans, etc. Diocesan Priests are distinct from religious Priests and do not benefit from this collection. The other yearly second collection mentioned above is for "aged and infirm Priests." The amount collected is used by parishes to offset insurance costs/medical expenses of ailing and elderly Priests, but does not provide for a pension or a retired Priest's day-to-day expenses. This year Father's Day falls on the weekend of June 18-19. As we honor fathers, please consider a generous gift to assure a worthy pension/retirement for your spiritual father. May your generosity and the grateful prayers of our Priests be a source of abundant blessings for you and your loved ones.

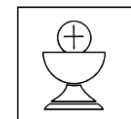

### Commentary on the Doctrine Of the Most Holy Eucharist

(Articles taken from the *Compendium of the Catechism of the Catholic Church*)

#### III. The Eucharistic Banquet: Communion

The Eucharistic Sacrifice of the Body and Blood of Christ includes the Real Presence and likewise the sacrificial banquet He established. Through participation in it, many things are effected, whether for individual members of the faithful or for the universal Church, especially the unity of the Church, as the Supreme Pontiff Benedict XVI explains in the Apostolic Exhortation *Sacramentum Caritatis* (no. 15).

Through the sacramental sacrifice of the Eucharist, the Church has the power to make her own the sacrifice of Christ who instituted this sacrament so that the Church herself might participate not only through the consent of the will but also in sacred communion. Christ made participants in His sacrifice those who shared in the banquet of the Last Supper, so that it might be a sacrifice of communion. (Continued next week)
