The First Reading tells how Melchizedek, king of Salem (early name for Jerusalem), comes to greet Abraham. Melchizedek is also a priest. As such he brings an offering of bread and wine to Abraham, and pronounces a blessing over him. In Christian tradition that bread and wine were taken to prefigure the bread and wine of the Eucharist.

Paul's account of the institution of the Eucharist is the earliest written account of the origin of the Eucharist (Second Reading). When we celebrate the Eucharist not merely is Christ present, but we re-enact the death by which he saved us. The Eucharist not only looks to the past, but also looks forward to the fulfillment of the Kingdom.

The eucharistic significance of the multiplication of the loaves is brought out by the use of liturgical language. Luke uses the same words here as at the Last Supper and at Emmaus: Jesus 'took...blessed...broke...gave...' In the Eucharist the Church continues the mission of Jesus to teach, to heal, and to nourish the people of God.

Commentary on the Doctrine Of the Most Holy Eucharist

(Articles taken from the Compendium of the Catechism of the Catholic Church)

III. The Eucharistic Banquet: Communion

(continued from last week)

It is clear that communion is not an appendix or some kind of addition to the Mass, but indispensable, since it is a sacrificial banquet, a banquet in which the participants full participate in the sacrifice. Therefore, communion does not refer only to the real presence of the Body and Blood, but also refers to the real presence of the sacrifice itself.

Christ instituted the Eucharist as the sacrifices were being made in preparation for the Passover banquet. Those victims were able through their participation to participate in His sacrifice. Thus, He made it so that the paschal banquet would be a sacrifice of communion: the lamb that was immolated in the Temple was consumed in commemoration of that lamb whose blood saved the people from slavery (Ex 12:1-4). Christ, the new paschal victim, wills to join His followers to His oblation to the Father which was to be consummated once and for all by Him in the Cross in a bloody manner the following day.
