The First Reading relates the call of Elisha. By throwing his cloak over him Elijah was symbolizing the transfer of power. We see how total was the response of Elisha. In slaughtering the oxen and burning the plough, he was precluding a return to his old way of life. Jesus demanded a similar response from those who would follow him.

In the Gospel we begin a new section of Luke's Gospel (9:51-18:14): Jesus' journey to Jerusalem. Luke portrays Jesus as one who knows his destiny and accepts it from God. But he is not interested in telling us the actual route Jesus followed. Instead, he tells us about incidents that happened along the way.

In the first passage we see the hostility Jesus encountered from the inhabitants of a Samaritan village, and his refusal to retaliate as James and John suggested. This is followed by the stories of three would-be followers of Jesus. Jesus tells them that total commitment is demanded of a disciple. The choices are not between good and evil, but between the good and the best.

Commentary on the Doctrine Of the Most Holy Eucharist

(Articles taken from the Compendium of the Catechism of the *Catholic Church*)

III. The Eucharistic Banquet: Communion a) Incorporated into Christ

(Continued from last week)

If Christ is present in the Eucharist under the forms of food and drink, there is little doubt that He wills to give the maximum gift of Himself to men. Since the mystery of the Incarnation is continued in the Eucharist, through the Eucharist men are especially joined to Christ and He Himself dwells most intimately in them: "For my flesh is true food, and my blood is true drink. Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood, remains in me and I in him" (Jn 6:55-56). In a most marvelous fashion, we are made sharers of the divine nature.

The Council of Trent teaches that Christ willed that we receive the Eucharist as the spiritual food of our souls and likewise as the antidote by which we are freed from daily faults and preserved from mortal sins (Ecumenical Council of Trent, Session XIII, chapter 2: DS 1638). The Eucharist strengthens our spiritual life while it joins us to Christ, and it safeguards us from sins because spiritual delight and infused charity are increased in those living for Christ, protecting them from being overcome by the allurement of sin.
