Luke has the giving of the Spirit happening on the feast of Pentecost. Jewish tradition saw Pentecost as the feast of the giving of the Law on Mount Sinai. According to a legend a mighty wind turned to fire and a voice proclaimed the Law. In a further refinement, the fire split into seventy tongues corresponding to the seventy nations of the world, to convey that the Law was proclaimed not only to Israel, but to all nations.

Luke exploits this tradition. He, too, has the mighty wind and tongues of fire coming upon the group of disciples. But for Luke the universal proclamation was not that of the Law, but of the Good News, a proclamation that has undone the sentence of Babel and re-united the scattered nations.

In his Gospel John has the giving of the Spirit happening on Easter Day. However, we must avoid any impression of a two-fold initial solemn bestowal of the Spirit. Luke and John are saying the same thing: the risen Lord gives the gift of the Sprit, and inaugurates the mission of the Church. That they differ in their dating is due to theological concerns.

#### Commentary on the Doctrine Of the Most Holy Eucharist

(Articles taken from the Compendium of the Catechism of the Catholic Church)

#### II. The Real Presence of Christ in the Eucharist

4. Consequences for the Christian Life (continued from last week) The Church, therefore, must adore Christ in this sacrament. Adoration is a very simple act, for it is enough if we say to Christ: you are for me the first and most powerful of all things. Christ is the summit of the Christian religion; all other things follow from Him. We believe in God and keep His commandments. But, to keep the commandments perfectly, we must be on fire with the love of Christ, from which comes the duty of adoration: which is to say, to will that Christ become our life.

In the Profession of Faith of Paul VI, we are clearly exhorted to venerate the Eucharist: "And it is our very sweet duty to honor and adore in the blessed Host which our eyes see, the Incarnate Word whom they cannot see, and who, without leaving heaven, is made present before us."

This worship, as John Paul II teaches us, must be preeminent in our every encounter with the Most Blessed Sacrament, whether when we visit our churches or when the Sacred Species are brought and given to the sick. "The encouragement and the deepening of Eucharistic worship are proofs of that authentic renewal which the Council set itself as an aim and of which they are the central point. And this, venerable and dear brothers, deserves separate reflection. The Church and the world have a great need of Eucharistic worship. Jesus waits for us in this sacrament of love. Let us be generous with our time in going to meet Him in adoration and in contemplation that is full of faith and ready to make reparation for the great faults and crimes of the world. May our adoration never cease." In the presence of the Eucharist, the will to make reparation cannot be separated from the will to adore.
