The First Reading is part of a poem written after the return from the Babylonian exile. It paints a glowing picture of the blessings God will bestow on Jerusalem and its inhabitants. It likens Jerusalem to a mother who lovingly nurses her children. It foreshadows the blessings that will result from the coming of the Kingdom of God with Jesus (Gospel). While all the synoptic Gospels record a sending out of the Twelve, only Luke records the sending out of seventy-two disciples. This second sending out is explained by the size of the harvest, and the fact that time is short, and Jesus can't do it all by himself. It also foreshadows the preaching of the Gospel to the whole world, a favorite theme of Luke. The mission of the disciples was an extension of Jesus' own mission. In understanding his instructions to them, we must remember that this was only a temporary mission, of short duration and limited to the surrounding Jewish towns and villages.

Commentary on the Doctrine Of the Most Holy Eucharist

III. The Eucharistic Banquet: Communion b) The unity of the Church

(Continued from last week)

Communion with the body of Christ through the Eucharist effects the full unity of the Church. Not only do we build up the Church but we are also joined to Christ, as St. Paul hands on: "Because the loaf of bread is one, we, though many, are one body, for we all partake of the one loaf" (1 Cor 10:17).

Rightly is it said that the Church confects the Eucharist, and truly does the Eucharist build up the Church, because the sharers of the one table manifest their fraternity and consensus as Christ's faithful. For in the Didache (9:4), we read that the bread to be consecrated, arising from many grains and growing together into one, signifies the unity of the Church gathered into one. The Fathers of the Church expounded on the unity of the Church shown forth through the Eucharist, which not only proclaims unity but makes it truly real. Therefore, St. Thomas Aquinas affirms that the grace or *res* (the reality) of this sacrament is precisely the unity of the Mystical Body of Christ.
