Amos was the prophet of social justice. He spoke to the wealthy of both Judah and Israel, who were unconcerned about what was happening to the country, which was about to be destroyed by the Assyrians. Indeed, by their life-style they were undermining the very fabric of the country. And they hadn't the slightest concern for the plight of the poor. Amos warned them that they would be the first to be led off into exile.

This is precisely the sin of the rich man (Dives) in the Gospel: cushioned by a lavish life-style, he is oblivious to the presence of a poor man at his gate. Dives was a worldling who didn't look beyond the good things of this life. It's a parable about the responsibility of wealth. Some of the harshest words in the Bible are directed at the uncaring rich.



**Blessed Carlo Acutis:** He was a young Italian boy who had a great love for Jesus in the Eucharist. His simple yet sincere devotion to the Faith caused Carlo's parents to become practicing Catholics and at their son's request, they started to attend daily Mass with him. This millennial

saint, however, is most known for his devotion to the Eucharist, for he documented all known Eucharistic miracles and even created a website containing information of each miracle! Though he died at the age of fifteen, his devotion to the Eucharist inspired all those around him, and enabled him to leave behind a beautiful testimony of his love for the Eucharist: his Eucharistic miracle website. Today all people throughout the world have access to Carlo's website to deepen their knowledge and love for Christ in the most Blessed Sacrament. Carlo also challenges us to learn about Eucharistic miracles, and so acquire a deeper understanding of God's love for us as well as strengthen our belief in the Real Presence.

**Bishop Gregory Mansour of the Maronite Eparchy of Saint Maron of Brooklyn has given his parishes seven tips to increase their devotion to the Holy Eucharist** – methods anyone who wants to pursue a deeper understanding of the sacrament can use. Each week, for the next seven weeks, we will list one of his steps:

1. Prepare for the Eucharistic sacrifice.

Preparing oneself for the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass should include reflections on the liturgical readings, careful preparation of the liturgical music, and observation of the one-hour fasting rule.

According to Code of Canon Law: "One who is to receive the most Holy Eucharist is to abstain from any food or drink, with the exception only of water and medicine, for at least the period of one hour before Holy Communion" (Can. 919 §1).

This one-hour fast is <u>not required</u> for those who are elderly or ill. In addition, the liturgy deserves its "appropriate dignity" and "careful observance," which includes abiding by the canonical norms and the guidance the Church offers on the liturgy.
