The First Reading talks about a new covenant between God and his **people.** This new covenant was brought about through the death of Jesus: "This cup is the new covenant in by blood" (Lk 22:20).

In the Gospel Jesus talks about his imminent death. It shows the very real disquiet with which he approached it. But it also stresses that what was to take place was within the purposes of God. Jesus uses the example of a grain of wheat dying in order to yield a harvest, thereby suggesting that his own death will bear much fruit.
