Jeremiah indicts the official leaders for neglecting their duties towards the people (First Reading). They must shoulder the blame for the misfortune that has befallen the people. But God will not let his people languish. He himself will assume the mantle of leadership, and entrust the flock to good and faithful shepherds.

This ties in neatly with the gospel. Jeremiah's promise is fulfilled in Jesus. We see Jesus, the Good Shepherd, in action. Firstly, we see his care for the Twelve, who have just returned from their missionary work and need a break. Secondly, we see his care for the ordinary people, whom he teaches at length. What a contrast there is between him and the official leaders of his time. Little wonder that the people flocked to him. In Jesus we see the divine compassion in action.

However, the U.S. Catholic Bishops approved the transfer of the celebration of this observance to the first Sunday after Labor Day, which is Sunday, September 8th.

The theme chosen by the Holy Father, "Do not cast me off in my old age" (cf. Psalm 71:9), wishes to call attention to the fact that, sadly, loneliness is the bitter lot in the lives of many elderly, so often the victims of the throw-away culture. He has invited everyone "to show our tender love for grandparents and the elderly members of our families."

The purpose of this day is to:

-Acknowledge and celebrate the wisdom, experience, and contributions of older generations to families, communities, and the Catholic Church.

-Foster connections between young people and the elderly, encouraging mutual respect, learning, and support.

-Highlight the challenges faced by many elderly individuals, such as isolation and loneliness, and promote initiatives to provide them with companionship and care.

-Emphasize the inherent dignity and value of every human life, from conception to natural death, and the importance of caring for the elderly.

In his message, Pope Francis stresses the importance of remembering and valuing the elderly around us, urging younger generations to draw from their wisdom and experiences. He highlights that grandparents and the elderly are a treasure to our families and society, providing a link to our history and a source of strength and guidance for the future.
