We have now entered Part Two of Mark's Gospel (8:27-16:8). After having been consistently rejected and misunderstood despite all he has said and done, Jesus starts to proclaim the necessity of the suffering, death, and resurrection of the Son of Man in God's plan.

The First Reading talks about the Servant of the Lord who suffers, not in spite of his innocence, but because of it. But he is sustained in all his trials by the firm belief that God is with him. The Suffering Servant represents the many suffering just people. The New Testament sees Jesus as the Suffering Servant par excellence.

In the Gospel we have Peter's profession of faith. In response to that confession, Jesus makes a threefold disclosure: that the Messiah must suffer, that his disciples must be prepared to share his suffering, and that his and their suffering will lead to ultimate glory.

St. Joseph, the Perpetual Adorer

Saint Joseph was a perpetual adorer of Jesus. He first adored him hidden behind the immaculate veil of Mary's holy womb. Next, he adored Jesus in the cave of Bethlehem, the world's first public adoration chapel. When St. Joseph was

commanded by the angel to flee from Herod and take his wife and son to Egypt, he adored Jesus in pagan territory. When the Holy Family returned to Nazareth after being in Egypt for many years, St. Joseph daily adored Jesus for decades. Whether on family outings to Jerusalem, visitations to relatives, or walking about in the countryside, St. Joseph never ceased adoring Jesus. He is the perpetual and model adorer. In a certain sense, St. Joseph is the founder of adoration chapels. Wherever he traveled with his wife and son, his paternal leadership transformed the home into an adoration chapel. He is the first to conduct a procession with the Body and Blood of Christ when he fled to Egypt with his infant Son. He is also the model for nocturnal adorers, that is, those who adore our Lord during the night. In all these things, St. Joseph offers us a superb model of how to adore Jesus. Undoubtedly, St. Joseph reached the heights of union with God because of his adoration of Jesus. Imitate St. Joseph and be his faithful spiritual child and you, too, will be capable of intimate union with God. Place yourself daily at the feet of Jesus and adore him.
