On the last Sunday of the Church's liturgical year, we think of the end and of judgement. The apocalyptic vision from the Book of Daniel sets the tone (First Reading). It talks about the coming of 'a son of man', a title for the future redeemer. It is not clear that Jesus referred to himself as "Son of Man' in this apocalyptic sense, but the early Christians certainly did

Basing itself on this same text from Daniel, Revelation looks to Jesus' coming at the end of time, when he will take full possession of his kingdom (Second Reading).

The Gospel, where the Lectionary once again shifts to John, contains a section from the Passion narrative: Jesus is being interrogated by Pilate. The issue here is the nature of Jesus' kingship.

What is Adoration?

Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament is a form of prayer that began centuries ago. The word adoration means, "to pay honor or homage to someone or something." As Catholics

we have the opportunity to pay honor to the One who deserves all our praise. The same Eucharist we receive at Mass is what (or more accurately Who) we worship in Adoration. During Adoration, we have the opportunity to come face-to-face with the living God. Like spending time with a close friend, Eucharistic Adoration is about deepening and strengthening our personal relationship with God. To tell you the truth, I've only just recently discovered Eucharistic Adoration and I love it! Now I know most of you are thinking, "Okay and......what does this have to do with me?" It is such a blessing to be able to receive Christ's Body and Blood into my very being at Mass. Yet there are times when I just want to spend time gazing at Him in love and awe.
