Amos was the prophet of social justice. He spoke to the wealthy of both Judah and Israel, who were unconcerned about what was happening to the country, which was about to be destroyed by the Assyrians. Indeed, by their lifestyle they were undermining the very fabric of the poor. Amos warned them that they would be the first to be led off into exile.

This is precisely the sin of the rich man (Dives) in the Gospel: cushioned by a lavish lifestyle, he is oblivious to the presence of a poor man at his gate. Dives was a wordling who didn't look beyond the good things of this life. It's a parable about the responsibility of wealth. Some of the harshest words in the Bible are directed at the uncaring rich.


